## Director's Corner



Labor Day. Wikipedia describes it as: "a public holiday celebrated in the U.S. on the first Monday in September. It honors the American labor movement and the contributions that workers have made to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of the country." We Americans are a different breed aren't we. We carry with us the Puritan work ethic which emphasizes hard work, discipline and frugality. But believe it or not, we're slipping. Yep. In 1950 we averaged 36.92 hours per week. Today we're down to 32.76 hours. And if I asked ten people, I'll bet at least 9 of them would say the reason is technology. There are so many advances in technology and mechanization that a "robot" can now do the work of 3 employees. Is that a bad thing? I don't pretend to know. But what I do know is that we need to shift our focus on how to educate our youth. We need classes that keep the youth engaged in the latest technological advances; classes that teach them not just how to operate them from a user standpoint, but how to build them, maintain them, and design them. This is the future if you hope to be gainfully employed. Will there still be manual labor jobs and jobs that require little or no specialized education? Of course there will. But there won't be many. And the higher pay (i.e. wages that can actually support a family) will be in technology. It is pointless complaining about the fact that we are in a Technological cyclone which continues to gather momentum as it sweeps through society. We need to be proactive and make sure that our youth will still continue to be the most competitive on the planet when it comes to innovation in the technological arena. I'm not judging anyone for their choices in life, but no longer will an education in "Bowling Industry Management" get you very far. And before you think I'm making that one up, it really is a major offered at Vincennes University in Evansville, IN. We need to be finding new and better ways to engage children in science and mathematics (the core qualifications for technology). Yes English is important. Yes a well-rounded education is useful. But by the time college comes around, it's time to specialize or we're going to be left behind by countries like China and Singapore who steal our technology now but will soon outsmart us by learning how to do what we do, only better, and cheaper. We cannot continue to placate those who insist that basket weaving is good for the soul. That may be true, but the soul is going to be awfully sad when it's jobless, homeless and starving. And by the way, China & Singapore's work weeks? 41.24 & 43.98 respectively. I recently took my mom to see Neil De Grasse Tyson, astrophysicist/cosmologist who illustrated how the US produced 3x the amount of scientific papers than the next leading country (Japan) through 2001, but now is being dwarfed by Asia as a whole (Japan, Korea, Singapore, China). We cannot afford to be at the mercy of Asia as they write the book on how the world will turn. I know for sure I will be encouraging my grand kids to bulk up on science & math classes.
